## FROM PASTOR MARK

Psalm 8.3-4 Matthew 6.25-34

I am grateful for the emphasis on mental health awareness in our culture today. As someone who battles chronic depression and anxiety, finding healthy ways to address this quixotic connection of mind, body, and spirit can be challenging. There are no x-rays, blood tests, or empirical measures that we can definitively point to and diagnose, "Aha! You suffer from depression." And the path to treatment is even less clear, far more "let's see if this works."

Nothing in my life has led me to feel more of an outsider than my battle with mental health. It can be isolating, creating distance in relationships when that is the last thing I needed. It can be frustrating, wanting to do something and yet not having the energy or desire to act on the thought. It can be embarrassing, having to admit that some unseen, unexplainable, unprovable force is acting upon me preventing me from engaging in my work, family, and social life in the manner I am accustomed.

For over thirty years, I have sought counseling, medical advice, studied and read on my own about depression and anxiety. I have collected much knowledge along the way. And as the fields of counseling, medicine, and the academy have grown in their own respective knowledge and understanding, so too have I.

However, repeatedly, what I have needed most was **hope**. In the most desperate of times, when I felt isolated, frustrated, misunderstood, and embarrassed, what I have needed most is to know that what I was experiencing in the moment was temporary, that I was not alone, and to be reminded that I am worthy of love.

As we make our journey through Lent this year, we will be exploring stories of people Jesus encountered who in their own ways were considered outsiders, outcasts, and outlaws. We will see and hear the people who in their day struggled to be seen and heard. We will listen in on conversations Jesus has with those on the fringes, those considered dangerous, and those considered unclean. Perhaps along the way, their story will become intertwined with ours.

I get into the Word as fast as I can reading the Bible, and being grounded in the Word.


#### Do you have a favorite Bible verse?
