FROM PASTOR MARK



CARING FOR EACH OTHER THROUGH STEPHEN MINISTRY

Walking with each other through difficulty, grief and change is in the DNA of Pineville United Methodist Church. In 1996, the Church commissioned its first class of Stephen Ministers and the ministry is going strong in 2023 with a new class of four Stephen Ministers set to be commissioned on May 21 in the 11:00 a.m. service in the Crossroads Center.

First and foremost, Stephen Ministry provides a caring ear and a connection to resources for anyone struggling after a crisis, like a death, health challenges, a job loss, or any kind of change.

"Grief is very heavy to carry by yourself. As a Stephen Minister, we're not in there to solve anything, we're there as a conduit for God's love and healing. We focus on the process of the caregiving and walking alongside someone navigating these changes," says Diane Hill, who heads up the ministry at Pineville UMC.

Diane decided to become a Stephen Minister to know what to say when friends were struggling. "I had gone through some deaths in the family and of friends and I was very interested in Stephen Ministry. I thought 'I'll be able to find out exactly what to say to help someone," Diane says. When she learned that training took 50 hours over the course of 20 weeks, she reconsidered. But God kept nudging and Diane was commissioned in 2014. After shepherding this important ministry through the challenges and changes of the pandemic years, she's excited to see it continue to grow - both in Stephen Ministers and care receivers.

Debbie Eaker was part of the inaugural class of Stephen Ministers in 1996. She says, "Often, what people need is someone to sit with them and just listen. It helps to have someone on the outside, not a family member or a friend, who is there to listen - not to give opinions, not to judge - just to listen."

Care receivers are paired one-on-one with a Stephen Minister based on gender (men are paired with men and women are paired with women) and on the particulars of their current crisis.
