Remember and Give Thanks

In February 2022, the leadership of Pineville UMC approved a plan to step forward in faith to follow the mission to make disciples rooted in Christ and community. In November 2022, the church leadership took the bold step to strategically invest financial resources into the vision God has set forth.

Evaluation and accountability are always important when a church takes a leap of faith to invest the prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness of the community of faith into a specific plan of action. Evaluation of ministry is often a tricky endeavor! How do you account for the work of God and to what do you attribute that work? It is not always straightforward. And yet, we do our best.

Jesus told stories to reveal the kingdom of God. Jesus used parables about everyday events to open the eyes of anyone who would listen. Jesus engaged in relationships, took risks, met people's needs, dared to cross cultural and religious boundaries. The disciples wrote these stories down for us as a witness to us, as if to say, "This is what following Jesus looks like! This is the Way!"

Following the lead of Jesus, the Storyteller, Melissa McGill, our Communications Director, has brought her passion for storytelling to life through the pages of the Pineville Connection, the weekly bulletin, our social media as well as videos highlighting many of the amazing ministries God is working through here. And we are excited to welcome the newest member of our storytelling team, Meriwether Minnix!

Stories such as how God is working through Martin Dickey, our Music Director relaunching the adult choir, helping to form Pineville Academy and host more than 100 middle schoolers at band camp this summer! How God has been at work through Kelly Chiseck, our Family and Children's Director, whose Family Nights, monthly Family Faith Activities, and most recently our Superheroes VBS 2023! How God has been at work through Jessica Edwards, our Assistant Pastor, whose days are filled with lunches and visits and phone calls as she carries out her calling to be a shepherd.

How God has been at work through our Stephen Ministers, our Prayer Ministry Team, our Life Groups, our Outreach Team, our United Methodist Women, our Prayer Quilt Ministry, our Hospitality Team, our Worship Team.

Behind the scenes, and yet so vital to everything that happens in this place, is the work of Sarah Willis, our Administrative Assistant. Every story I just listed every meeting, every event that takes place in this facility, runs through her office. To watch how God is at work in this church, and to see how Sarah is growing with the job and the responsibilities is a story in itself. A story still being written.

In addition to stories, Jesus taught about the gift of discernment. He used the imagery of a tree bearing fruit. In the church, we rely on numbers at times as a measurement to discern. In August, we will begin printing the attendance and offering in a new format in the weekly bulletin. Our intention is to provide the information in a more accurate and understandable context. Yet it is always important to remember that numbers are not the mission. Our mission is to make disciples.

Our average total attendance, in person and online, has increased from 103 as of January 2022 to 141 as of July 2023. We added a second service in September of 2022. We have continued to livestream our service and have a solid core of regulars.

Financially, through June 2023, the church is approximately \$40k ahead in giving over this time in 2022. While we are short of our projected budget, we are \$10k ahead income to expenses.

As a pastor, I have always been more concerned about income to expenses than necessarily making budget. The budget is a guide and a goal. The fiduciary responsibility of the pastor and church leadership is to make sure the church operations are solvent. To that end our staff team and church leaders continue to be faithful stewards of what has been entrusted to the church.

I invite us all to remember and give thanks. To call to mind the deeds of the Lord as the Psalmist exhorts. To meditate on the work of God in our midst. To reflect on what God has done, what God is doing, and where God is leading.

And may we have the faith and courage to continue to follow. Grace and peace.

What do you enjoy in your free time?


I have a bunch of hobbies, such as video games, Dungeons & Dragons and knitting.

ON THE LORD'S PRAYER


A MESSAGE FROM THE PUMC EDUCATION TEAM

Prayer, at its core is communication with God, and communication is the foundation of relationship. So, prayer is as important today as it was 2,000 years ago. The Lord's Prayer appears twice in scripture; in Matt 6:9-13 as part of the Sermon on the Mount and in Luke 11 when during Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, he was asked by one of his disciples, "Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples." In response, Jesus gave us The Lord's Prayer.

Have you ever noticed how much "us" language is in the Lord's Prayer? There are no individual requests in the Lord's Prayer. Everything is communal. The prayer separates us from the tendency to focus on ourselves and assumes that we are praying both with others and for them. Jesus teaches us to pray for God's ways above our own.

The Lord's Prayer

"Pray then in this way:
Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come.
Your will be done,
on earth as it is
in heaven.
Give us this day
our daily bread.
And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our
debtors.
And do not bring us
to the time of trial,
but rescue us from
the evil one.
Matthew 6:9-13



ON THE LORD'S PRAYER, CONTINUED...

The 10 lines of the Lord's Prayer teach 5 key themes.

1. Praise We recognize God's holiness when we pray. He is close and caring, but he's not our pal, nor our equal. He is God Almighty.

2. Kingdom We pray for God's sovereign rule in our lives and on this earth. He is our king. We desire God's Kingdom to be extended to others in our world, and that his creation in the here and now be renewed according to what he originally intended.

3. Needs We trust God to meet our needs and the needs of others ("Give us today our daily bread"). It is fine to pray for our own needs, but we must care for the needs of all of God's creation, not just our own. Tomorrow, we will renew our dependence by coming to him in prayer once again.

4. Forgiveness We search our hearts and recognize that we need his forgiveness. Just as our Father graciously forgives us, we must grant that same forgiveness to others. This is part of what it means to bear God's image.

5. Guidance We are all subject to temptations, and left to our own devices, we will succumb to them. But God doesn't just forgive us. He also helps us. He's given us the gift of His Holy Spirit to strengthen and guide us. We ask that his gift penetrates our hearts so we can receive its guidance and avoid the traps and temptations of the evils around us.

Jesus gave the world a prayer that seems relatively short and simple. Yet, it's packed with beauty, tenderness, and grandeur. A thoughtful reading shows it to contain truths about God, about his plan for creation, about us, and about how we might go about fostering a right relationship with him. Short and simple? Yes, but Jesus meant it to be that way. He was intentional about everything he did and spoke. Sometimes, prayer can feel intimidating. Often, people wonder how to pray or feel like they don't pray well enough. Most of us have had those feelings. But prayer is talking to the God who loves you and wants to hear from you. So don't make it harder than it needs to be. Just start a conversation. And if you don't know where to start, start with the Lord's Prayer.
